They may attempt to disclose abuse by giving adults clues, through their actions and by using indirect words (Allnock and Miller, 2013; Cossar et al, 2013). Adults need to be able to notice the signs that a child or young person might be distressed and ask them appropriate questions about what might have caused this.

However, if the abuser routinely retaliates against their partner for complaining about abusive behaviors, justifies their actions or shifts blame, delivers insincere or angry apologies, denies what they did or demonstrates any disrespectful or degrading behaviors, leaving is probably the appropriate choice. ...
