For older patients, especially those who are very old or frail, history-taking and physical examination may have to be done at different times, and physical examination may require 2 sessions because patients become fatigued.

Older Adults' Health and Age-Related Changes

Cognitive impairment in older adults has a variety of possible causes, including medication side effects, metabolic and/or endocrine derangements, delirium due to intercurrent illness, depression and dementia, with Alzheimer's dementia being most common. Some causes, like medication side effects and depression, can be reversed with treatment.

The goals of intervention include promoting autonomy, reducing morbidity and mortality, and improving the older adult's quality of ...

Risk assessment and intervention for vulnerable older ...

Prevalent issues experienced by older adults include: sleep disorders, problems with eating or feeding, incontinence, confusion, evidence of falls, and skin breakdown. Familiarity with these commonly-occurring issues helps the nurse prevent unnecessary iatrogenesis and promote optimal function of the aging individual.

Assessment for Children, Teens, Adults and Older Adults

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Sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, stroke, vascular dementia, and substance abuse in addition to the well older adult. It has been tested in 14 different languages, ages ranging from as young as 49 in two reports to old-old (85+) with a variety of education levels. The total possible score is 30 points with a score of 26 or more considered normal.

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
