* From the fifth bar onward, the fingering for E-C# (Db) is the same as for an octave. * The actual pitch of an alto flute is four tones down from the written score. * The actual pitch of a bass flute is eight tones (one octave) down from the written score. * The actual pitch of a piccolo is eight tones (one octave) up from the written score.

A flute that is designed for beginners has plateau-style or closed-hole keys. That may sound confusing until you understand that the option for the advanced player is French or open-hole keys. On a flute with open-hole keys, there are holes at the center of the A, G, F, E and D keys that you have to cover with your fingers to make the flute work.
