Signs of physical abuse may include: Bruises, welts, or other injuries that can't be explained or don't match with the child's story Burns, especially from cigarettes, that can't be explained

Signs of physical abuse Bruising, welts or burns that cannot be sufficiently explained, particularly bruises on the face, lips and mouth of infants or on several surface planes at the same time Unusual bruising patterns that reflect the shape of the instrument used to cause injury (e.g., belt, wire hanger, hairbrush, hand, human bite marks)

Recognizing Child Abuse and Neglect: Signs and Symptoms

Behavior changes -> fear, anxiety, depression, withdrawal, aggression, not wanting to go home or go to a certain person's house, appearing withdrawn, afraid or nervous around certain individuals. Overly sexualized behavior. Use of explicit sexual language that's age inappropriate.

Some of these signs may indicate that a child is experiencing emotional abuse: appearing withdrawn, anxious, or afraid showing extremes in behavior, for example, compliance, passivity, or...

Physical signs of sexual abuse are rare. If you see these signs, bring your child to a doctor. Your doctor can help you understand what may be happening and test for sexually transmitted diseases. Pain, discoloration, bleeding or discharges in genitals, anus or mouth

Physical Signs. These are some physical signs that could indicate a problem, including the possibility of sexual abuse: Eating more or less than usual; Having trouble sleeping; Soiling or wetting clothes, or bedwetting (or an increase, if it happens already) Stomachaches; Physical pain or itching in the genital area

Signs of Sexual Abuse - Early, Open, Often

Physical Signs of Abuse Direct physical signs of sexual abuse are not common. However, when physical signs are present, they may include bruising, bleeding, redness and bumps, or scabs around the mouth, genital, or anus. Urinary tract infections, sexually transmitted diseases, and abnormal vaginal or penile discharge are also warning signs.

Identifying Child Sexual Abuse - Darkness to Light

Physical abuse is a nonaccidental physical injury to a child caused by a parent, caregiver, or other person responsible for a child and can include punching, beating, kicking, biting, shaking, throwing, stabbing, choking, hitting (with a hand, stick, strap, or other object), burning, or otherwise causing physical harm. 2

If you see a child with unexplained bruises, black eyes, choke marks around the neck, human bite marks, lash marks, or the like, it's your responsibility to report it to the proper authorities. All states have laws in place requiring you to report known or suspected child physical abuse or neglect.

What Is Child Physical Abuse? Physical Abuse of Children ...

Physical abuse is intentional bodily injury. Some examples include slapping, pinching, choking, kicking, shoving, or inappropriately using drugs or physical restraints. Signs of physical abuse. Sexual abuse is nonconsensual sexual contact (any unwanted sexual contact).

It's important to remember that physical abuse is any way of intentionally causing physical harm to a child or young person. It also includes making up the symptoms of an illness or causing a child to become unwell. Signs of physical abuse. Bumps and bruises don't always mean a child is being physically abused.

Physical abuse | NSPCC

Signs in parents and caregivers. frequent visits with the child or young person in their care to health or other services with unexplained or suspicious injuries, swallowing of non-food substances or with internal complaints. explanation of injury offered by the parent is not consistent with the injury.

Signs of abuse - Child at risk of harm and neglect ...

Adults who were the victims of child abuse are at higher risk for a variety of emotional and physical problems, as well as for economic problems. The most common physical problems are neurological and musculoskeletal problems, followed by respiratory, heart, and gastrointestinal ailments.

For example, a parent or caregiver withholds food from their child as a punishment for misbehaving. Physical abuse includes any behavior that involves the use of force to harm a child, such as punching, beating, kicking, biting, shaking, throwing, stabbing, choking, hitting or burning.
